

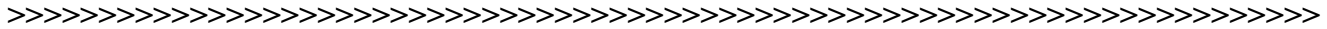

From the President's Desk.....

It is a great time for genealogy! There are several programs on television currently that relate to genealogy and of course there is the movie “Roots” that many of us watched several years ago. We all hope that these programs will inspire more people to become interested in finding out about their own roots (ancestors) and begin to create a Family Tree for the next generation. Ancestry.com also provides commercials that show snippets of someone receiving a clue that leads them back to their ancestors and the possibilities of so much more being discovered. Information and documents are becoming more available all the time and it is easy to see them by simply researching on the computer. For this reason, most people believe that they do not need to leave the comfort of their own home to enjoy the hobby of genealogy. BY-LAW UPDATE

The nominating committee worked very hard this year to find candidates to fill the positions on the ICGS board. After exhausting all possibilities, the nominating committee asked Diane **Bishop** if she would consider returning as President and Lorie **Neumann** to consider returning as Vice-President for another year. Diane agreed to return as President and Lorie agreed to return as Vice President if the committee could find someone to co-chair the position with her this next year. Lisa **Feury** agreed to co-vice president with Lorie for the coming fiscal year. With the problem of finding candidates solved there was another issue.

The current By-Laws state in **Article VI: Officers – Section 5. – No member shall be elected to the office of President or Vice-President for more than two full consecutive years.**

The proposed By-Law change was presented at the picnic in August prior to the announcement from the Nominating Committee of the proposed candidates for 2014 – 2015. The proposal was to eliminate Section 5 and change VI: Officers – Section 6 to become Section 5.

At the regular ICGS Society meeting on Thursday, September 11, 2014, the proposed By-Law change was once again presented to the membership in attendance and a motion for a vote was accepted. The By-Law was voted on and accepted at that time. The By-Laws have been updated as follows:

VI: Officers

Section 5. – Vacancies in office, other than the President, shall be filled by appointment of the President to fill out the unexpired term, with the approval of the Executive Board. In case of a vacancy in the office of the President, the Vice President shall become President.

INGHAM COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be "Ingham County Genealogical Society".

ARTICLE II: OBJECTS

The objects and purposes for which this Society is formed are to do any and all things herein set forth:

- Section 1. To preserve and make available for research the genealogical records of our members.
- Section 2. To encourage and assist the study of family history, to promote the exchange of knowledge, and to encourage the deposit of genealogical records.
- Section 3. To cooperate with other genealogical groups and societies and to assist the area libraries in expanding and publicizing their genealogical holdings.
- Section 4. To publish materials of interest and use to genealogists.
- Section 5. Any other legal educational activity.

ARTICLE III: BASIS OF ORGANIZATION

- Section 1. The Ingham County Genealogical Society shall be conducted as an independent non-profit organization.
- Section 2. The operating expenses of the Society shall be covered by membership dues, service charges, donations, and fund-raising activities approved by the Society.
- Section 3. All facilities of the Society shall be available equally to members in good standing. For the purpose of this section, a member in good standing is defined as one who is current in payment of dues and not subject to disciplinary action.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Any person interested in genealogy, history, or biography, either amateur or professional, may become a member of the Society.
- Section 2. Membership shall be either Active, Honorary, or Associate.
- Section 3. Active members only shall vote, hold office, and serve on committees.
- Section 4. Active membership (open only to individuals) shall be obtained by the payment of dues, the amount of which shall be determined by vote of the Society. Annual dues shall be payable at the Sept. meeting of the Society, and any member failing to pay the dues following the expiration of the paid-up membership shall be notified in writing of the delinquency. If the dues are unpaid by December 31, the member shall be dropped from membership. Dues from new members paid after June 1 will apply to the new fiscal year.
- Section 5. Honorary membership (without dues) shall be conferred by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the active membership present at a regular meeting of the Society.
- Section 6. Associate membership (without vote) shall be available to organizations upon payment of regular annual dues.
- Section 7. All records and data compiled by the Society shall be accessible to members. Members using such data in publications shall make acknowledgment of the source. The Society is entitled to authorize publication of any material in its holdings.

ARTICLE V: FISCAL YEAR - The fiscal year shall begin October 1, and end September 30 of the following year.

ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS

- Section 1. The officers of the Society shall be the President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Membership Secretary, Treasurer, Librarian, and two Trustees. Any additional officers as may be deemed necessary shall be elected by a majority vote at any regular business meeting.
- Section 2. The President will appoint a nominating committee June 1. This committee will nominate candidates for the offices to be filled for the next fiscal year, and report to the members in August. Additional nominations from the floor will be permitted with approval of the persons so nominated.
- Section 3. All officers shall be elected annually at the September meeting and shall take office as of October 1, and continue in office for one year or until their successors are elected and qualify.
- Section 4. A majority of all votes cast shall be necessary to constitute an election.
- Section 5. Vacancies in office, other than the President, shall be filled by appointment of the President to fill out the unexpired term, with the approval of the Executive Board. In case of a vacancy in the office of the President, the Vice President shall become President.

ARTICLE VII: EXECUTIVE BOARD

- Section 1. Current elected officers and the immediate Past President shall constitute the Executive Board.
- Section 2. The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the society except as limited herein. The Executive Board shall be subject to the orders of the Society.
- Section 3. The Executive Board will meet at the call of the President.

ARTICLE VIII: DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Section 1. The duties of officers shall be such as are indicated by their respective titles, and such as are specified in these by-laws.
- Section 2. The President shall, upon election to office, appoint all standing committees. The President shall be ex-officio as a member of all committees without right to vote. The President shall be authorized to sign checks in case of absence or disability of the Treasurer. The President presides at all general, special, and Executive Board Meetings.
- Section 3. The Vice-President shall act as chairperson of the Program Committee and in the absence of the President shall assume all the duties and authorities of that office.
- Section 4. The Recording Secretary shall conduct general correspondence of the Society and record minutes of the regular and Executive Board meetings.
- Section 5. The Membership Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all members, give due notice of all meetings, and act as chairperson of the Membership Committee.

ARTICLE VIII: DUTIES OF OFFICERS continued

- Section 6. The Treasurer shall receive all dues and other monies, attend to all disbursements, and keep all the account of the society.
Section 7. The Librarian shall be responsible for the contents and operation of the Society's Reference Room.
Section 8. Trustees shall review bills, and audit the accounts every six months.
Section 9. All officers, upon retiring from office, shall deliver to their successors, all records and other property belong to the Society.

ARTICLE IX: COMMITTEES AND SPECIAL OFFICERS

- Section 1. There shall be standing committees, namely Computer, Social, Program, Publicity, Fund-raising, Publications, and Newsletter.
Section 2. The chairperson of each standing committee shall, by November 1, file with the President an annual report of the committee's activities for the preceding membership year.
Section 3. The President shall appoint special committees as necessary.
Section 4. The President shall appoint a Historian (to collect and file documents and other material pertaining to the history of the Society), Michigan Genealogical Council Representatives and Alternates (to attend meetings of the Michigan Council and make reports thereof at the regular meeting of the Society) and a Delegate to the Federation of Genealogical Societies.

ARTICLE X: MEETINGS

- Section 1. There shall be at least eight meetings of the society per year, at the direction of the Executive Board.
Section 2. Special meetings may be called by the President or upon request of three members of the Executive Board.
Section 3. The practice of absentee or proxy voting shall not be followed by this Society.

ARTICLE XI: QUORUM

- Section 1: A quorum for the purpose of business transactions, at any meeting of the general membership shall be composed of not less than twenty active members.
Section 2: A quorum for the purpose of business transactions, at any meeting of the Executive Board shall be composed of not less than 5 Board Members.
Section 3: A quorum is not required for Committees.

ARTICLE XII: ORDER OF BUSINESS - The order of business of all meetings shall be as follows:

ARTICLE XIII: PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the latest edition of "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised" shall govern the society.

ARTICLE XIV: AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be adopted, amended or repealed at any regular meeting by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, providing proposed amendments shall have been submitted to the membership in writing at least 10 days prior to the meeting at which voted upon.

ARTICLE XV: DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of this Society, its assets, both financial and material, shall be transferred to another 501(c)(3) organization as may be decided at the last general meeting or the last meeting of the Executive Board, provided that items on loan to the Society will be returned to the owners or lenders; but such assets shall not in any event be divided among the members of the Society at any time.

Farmers Market Report

An article about the Farmer's Market in Mason appeared in an issue of the Ingham County Community News in July offering non-profit organizations a free booth rental to promote their group. I contacted the Market Master, Elaine **Ferris**. She invited our Society to take a place as many Saturdays as we wished.



Isabelle **Wells**, Joann **DePeel** and I prepared a booth containing information about the Society and Reference Room in the library. We had information on the Society and how to start tracing your roots. We represented the Reference Room in the library with posters about finding family information the newspapers and DVD's along with the numerous books we have available in our Reference Room.

On 8-19-2014, our booth was north of the courthouse on Maple Street. On that date we spoke to 29 people. Elaine asked us to come back on 8-23-2014 during the Mason Sun Dried Festival. This time we were set up in the pavilion at the park on Ash Street. We talked to 39 people that date. It was then that Elaine suggested we take part in the Farmer's Market in Dansville since Joann and I are from that area.

I contacted the Market Master there and she welcomed us to come there also. On Thursday afternoon, 9-4-2014, we set up there in the pavilion that they have at the west side of the Village near the school. This time Isabelle could not come but Diane **Bishop** filled in for her. We spoke to 29 people that afternoon.

To summarize: The spaces were FREE. The people were GREAT to deal with. We were able to engage in individual conversations with them and share what we could help them with. We also could tell them about the Society and the speakers that we offer at our monthly meetings. I have worked at all the Spring Fling and Down Home Days since becoming a member. A number of people do pass by and if they are not pushed along by the crowd some do show an interest in our presentation regarding The Ingham County Genealogy Society. However, you do not always have the chance to talk to them one on one as we had time to do at the Farmer's Markets.

I have learned that many of the other Farmer's Markets in the area also offer the opportunity for a non-profit organization to set up a booth to promote their own organization. Next year, I would like to suggest that we seek them out and have members living near these markets, volunteer to take part as we did in Mason and Dansville.

RESEARCH ROOM NEWS

After a few years absence, I am back again as our society's research room librarian. We will continue to be open Wednesdays from 12 noon until 4 p.m.

Volunteers are an essential part of the research room. There are all kinds of tasks that you can help doing. We need people to file, index, proof read, help visitors find information, prepare materials for the vertical files and more. If you have an hour or more some Wednesday, come up to the research room and help. No sign up is necessary.

One of the most popular collections continues to be the obituaries we have collected over the years. We add to the collection every year.

Remember the research room is always available to our members whenever the Mason Public Library is open. Show your membership card at the circulation desk and ask to use our room. Please remember to sign in and out when you use the room. This allows me to know how often the room is used on off hours. You do not have to return the books you use to their shelves. Just leave them on the table when you are finished and we will return the books to their correct location Wednesday morning.

Judy **Wallman**, a professional genealogy researcher in southern California, was doing some personal work on her own family tree.

She discovered that congressman Harry **Reid's** g-g-uncle, Remus **Reid**, was hanged for horse stealing and train robbery in Montana in 1889. Both Judy and Harry **Reid** share this common ancestor. The only known photograph of Remus show him standing on the gallows in Montana territory.

On the back of the photo is this inscription: 'Remus **Ried**, horse thief, sent to Montana territorial Prison 1885, escaped 1887, robbed the Montana Flyer six times. Caught by **Pinkerton** detectives, convicted and hanged in 1889'

So Judy recently e-mailed Congressman Harry **Reid** for information about their g-g uncle.

Believe it or not, Harry **Reid's** staff sent back the following biographical sketch for her genealogy research:

“Remus **Reid** was a famous cowboy in Montana Territory. His business empire grew to include acquisition of valuable equestrian assets and intimate dealings with the Montana railroad. Beginning in 1883, he devoted several years of his life to government service, finally taking leave to resume his dealing with the railroad.

In 1887, he was a key player in a vital investigation run by the renowned **Pinkerton** Detective Agency. In 1889, Remus passed away during an important civic function held in his honor when the platform upon which he was standing collapsed.”

Now that's how it's done, folks! That's a real POLITICAL SPIN!
