# **NEWS FROM THE PAST**

**(Typed as written)**

## **Ingham County News, Thursday, 7 January 1909**

A SUDDEN SUMMONS – Frederick Mortimer **Lewis** Dies Suddenly Monday Forenoon.

Last Monday forenoon our citizens were greatly surprised and shocked to hear that our fellow townsman and genial neighbor, F. M. **Lewis**, had fallen dead at his home on south Main street. What made the sensation more surprising was the fact that “Mort”, as he was commonly called, was seen by many of his friends on Sunday in apparently usual good and robust health.

He recently returned from Dakota where he has gone several seasons to assist in the grain harvest, feeling unusually fine. For several weeks he had assisted C. C. **Rolfe** in feeding and caring for a large bunch of cattle south of the city, and only Sunday evening complained of feeling sore and lame, retiring at his usual early hour. About three o'clock Monday morning he said to his wife that he felt bad and would get up and sit by the warm stove. She also arose and in due time had breakfast prepared. He felt so bad he declined to eat, and walked about the house complaining of his soreness and bad feelings. About 10:30 as he was coming from the kitchen to the sitting room he told his wife he was sick at the stomach and to get the wash bowl. She hurried to the bedroom, and heard him fall as he entered the sitting-room. He had pitched forward and fell flat upon his face, his arms laying straight beside his body, showing he had no time to throw them for protection. He was dead when she reached him. Neighbors and medical aid were summoned by the distracted wife, but all was over - “Mort” was asleep in death

Frederick Mortimer **Lewis** is the last of a family of five children. He was born in Alaiedon township, in this county, Jan. 30, 1846, since which time he has lived in and about Mason, a pioneer of sixty-two years. He was married to Miss Helen C. **Seely** June 6, 1867, who with a daughter Mrs. Jennie R. **Barker**, of Lansing survive him, besides a host of relatives and warm friends.

He was an honest man always under all circumstances, and kind hearted and generous to a fault, ever ready to assist a friend.

The funeral was held at the residence yester afternoon at two o'clock, Rev. **Simmons** officiating, with interment in Maple Grove cemetery.

Miss Jessie **Stevens** was pleasantly surprised by her schoolmates Wednesday, April 22d, the occasion being her 14<sup>th</sup> birthday. Warm sugar, fruit and cake were served. She received many useful presents.

Albert **Rouse** of Dewitt has been given a judgment of \$5,750 against the Michigan United Railways by a circuit court jury for the loss of his right leg in a street railway accident at Lansing a year ago. The trial lasted a week.

# LOCKE TOWNSHIP SOLDIERS WHO SERVED IN WORLD WAR I

(From the Locke Township, Ingham County, Michigan Microfilm Project)

Harry Watters,(Waters), Serial No. 2050698

He was single, color white. He was born in Bancroft, Mich. June 5, 1894 his parents being Wesley (deceased) and Jessie **Waters (Collins)**. He has one brother, Fred, who was assigned to Co. G, 78 Inf..

He registered in Locke June 5, 1917 for service and was called to Camp Custer April 28, 1918 where he was assigned to Pvt., Co. G., Inf. 85 div.; July 17, 1918-Camp Mills; transferred to Co. G. 338 Inf.; July 27, 1918-sailed overseas. Landed Liverpool, England Aug. 1918; Landed in France Aug. 1918; Dec. 1, 1918 was in army of occupation and with the 38 Inf. 85 division. He says he got up in France ate Christmas dinner in Luxemburg, Belgium and supper in Germany and then back to his company. He served in Battle of Meuse Argonne Sept. 30 to Oct. 27, 1918; St. Mihiel Sept. 12 to Sept. 14, 1918.

Received his discharge at Camp Sherman, Ohio Aug. 25, 1919

Pvt. Frederick Waters, Serial No. 7420352

Single, color white, was born at Webberville, Mich. March 7, 1896, his father being Wesley **Waters**, deceased, and his mother Jessie **Waters, Collins**. He was an American. He had one sister Iris Amelia who died in infancy and one brother Harry who was attached to the 38<sup>th</sup> Inf. Hdq. Co. Pvt. **Waters** registered in Locke for service June 5, 1917 and was called to Camp Custer, Aug. 30, 1918. He was assigned to Co. G, 78 Inf.

He was soon taken ill with influenza and after recovering he assisted the nurses in the hospital in caring for other soldiers ill with the same disease when, while carr(y)ing a tray to a comrade, he fell to the floor unconscious. He never rallied and died of bronichial pneumonia Oct. 27 1918. His body was shipped home in charge of his comrade **Walters**, and was laid to rest in the Rowley Cemetery, Locke, Mich. His remaining relatives are: his mother, Mrs. Jessie **Collins**, Williamston, Mich. And brother Harry in the Army of occupation in Germany, a step father, Henry **Collins**, two half sisters, Henrietta and Fannie, two half brothers, A. J. and Aurthur. At the time of entering service, he was working by the day at farming in Locke Twp.

Ray R. Welch (Welch), Serial No. 4542383

He was single, color white. He was born in Monroe Co., Mich. Jan. 27, 1896 his parents being James and Luella **Welch**. He has one sister, Mrs. Sam \_\_\_\_ (left blank) and three brothers, Norman, (note: the other two brothers were not named).

He registered in Locke for service June 5, 1917 and was called to Camp Aug. 31, 1918 to Radio Training Detachment, Bloomington, Indiana where he was assigned to Pvt. Co. A, Inf.

He received his discharge from there Dec. 21, 1918.

Bert R. Young, Serial No. 2047408

He was single, color white, his parents being John and Florence **Young**. He was born in Flint, Mich. Nov. 6, 1887. He has two sisters and one brother, namely, Mrs. Reda **Stewart**, Mrs. Lulu **Tuttle**, and Wallace **Young**.

He registered in Locke for service June 5, 1917 and was called to Camp Custer April 30, 1918 where he was assigned to Co. 13, 4<sup>th</sup> Bn., 160 Bridgade. May 1918-transferred to 388<sup>th</sup> Inf.; June 12, 1918-to Co. 26, Depot Bridgade; Nov. 30 1918-to Co. Co. G, 160 Depot Bridgade; Dec. 1, 1918 promoted to Coporal; Dec. 30, 1918-promoted to Sargent; Feb. 23, 1919-Hdg. Co. Depot Bridgade.

Received his discharge March 19, 1919.
